A Journeyperson certificate is your ticket to work meaning you can work in the full scope, including restricted tasks, of your trade, **anywhere in Alberta**.

For apprenticeship programs that participate in the Red Seal program, formally known as the Interprovincial Standards Red Seal Program. Upon successful completion of your apprenticeship and the interprovincial exam you will receive a Red Seal Endorsement on your Alberta Journeyperson credential. To recognize your achievement of earning your Red Seal Endorsement (RSE) you have earned the ability to use the initials RSE at the end of your signature to indicate you have achieved the Interprovincial standard of excellence in your trade.

The Red Seal program is a program that sets common standards to assess the skills of skilled trades professionals across Canada. Earning your Red Seal means you have met this national standard of excellence.



Furthermore, upon successful completion of your apprenticeship program you will qualify for a formal educational credential. Apprenticeship education credentials are recognized on [Alberta's Credential Framework](#), which outlines all credentials in Alberta—certificates, diplomas, bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, and doctoral degrees, and everything in between! Your academic credential is more than a piece of paper. It symbolizes your achievements and potential, opening doors to diverse opportunities.

FINANCIAL AID

Employment Insurance (EI)

Unlike other post-secondary students, an apprentice has the benefit of being able to collect employment insurance while in apprenticeship education classes.

- Apply for Employment Insurance on line no more than seven days before your last day of work
- Be aware that you may not receive employment insurance payments for as long as four to six weeks after you start classes
- You will need a 16-digit reference code to submit application

Canada Apprenticeship Loan

Apprentices registered in a Red Seal trade may be eligible for up to:

- \$4,000 in loans per period of apprenticeship education
- Five funded periods of apprenticeship education
- interest-free loan

Alberta Student Loan

Registered apprentices through AIT can also apply for an Alberta Student loan if they are in a designated apprenticeship education program and have been an Alberta resident for 12 months or longer.

AIT Scholarships:

Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training offers over 250 awards of \$1,000 and \$1,500 to apprentices annually.

Scholarships, Awards and Bursaries

SAIT offers more than 140 awards specific for apprentices. Each SAIT award has a list of requirements called criteria. If you meet these criteria, you can apply for that award. Eligibility criteria varies by award. Submit an application to be considered for eligible awards.



Apply on line on your MySait Student Account.

Once logged into your account, go to your MyStudent tab. Under the "My Finance" section you will find the "Student Awards and Financial Aid" link that will take you to the application portal. There you will also find the link to submit documents when applicable.



Collect SAIT Awards

The Alumni and Development advancement office will notify students selected for awards approximately four months after the application deadline. To collect a SAIT award, you must have a Canadian Social Insurance Number (SIN) or an Individual Tax Number (ITN.)

SAIT Student Email

All students have a SAIT email account. Your account is automatically activated within one day after you satisfy one of the following criteria:

- you accept your offer of admission to a credit program and pay your non-refundable tuition deposit, or
- you register for a continuing education course or apprenticeship training program.

Your login information will be sent to your personal email address.

Access your SAIT email through Microsoft 365 Online.

Your SAIT email password is the same as your Microsoft 365 password. This is also your password to log in to a SAIT computer and SAIT wireless. If you change your password for one, you change your password for the others as well. Always change your password from the default after you log in the first time.

PREPARE FOR CLASSES

PREP 145: Study Skills for Apprentices: PREP 145 is a free study skills course for apprentices. Discover your learning strengths, develop memory techniques, learn effective ways to conquer your modules, get tips on how to write multiple-choice tests, and prepare for your apprenticeship exam.

MATH 145: Math Prep for Apprentices: Build confidence in your foundational math skills before starting your apprenticeship training. This free prep course covers core topics such as algebra, ratios, percentages, angles, slopes, and basic geometry, with a focus on applied problem-solving. Flexible delivery options are available throughout the year.

Apprenticeship 101 (self-paced): This course provides a comprehensive introduction to the apprenticeship system in Alberta, including its historical roots, legislative framework, and the various pathways available to enter a trade. Participants will gain clarity on how the apprenticeship model works and how to take the first steps toward a rewarding trades career.

Apprenticeship 102 (self-paced): Ideal for Individuals already enrolled in an apprenticeship program. Building on the knowledge from Apprenticeship 101, this advanced course offers deeper insight into navigating the apprenticeship system effectively. Participants will learn about key milestones, practical strategies for progression, and how to achieve both the Journey person certificate and Red Seal Endorsement.

PROGRESSION TO THE NEXT PERIOD OF APPRENTICESHIP.

The formal education component (classroom instruction) of your apprenticeship journey is a partnership between AIT and your training provider. Classroom Instruction is part of your apprenticeship learning from instructors at a college, polytechnic institution or an industry training provider. This section of the handbook will detail your requirements to successfully complete classroom instruction and the provincial and/or inter provincial exams.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is mandatory and missed time will lead to consequences, up to and including termination from classroom instruction. Post-secondary institutions are required to monitor and record attendance on an hourly basis for each apprentice attending classroom instruction. Formal warnings will be issued at the 6-hour, 12-hour, and 18-hour of accumulated absences. These formal warnings will be reported and become part of your student record. Apprentices missing 18 or more hours of classroom instruction may have their enrollment in classroom instruction terminated. Your commitment to attending every session is crucial for your success and continuation in this program.

The attendance requirements are set by the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training. Documentation for each absence is necessary.

Exceptions will be considered only for exceptional circumstances such as incapacitating mental and/or physical illness or family issues. An exception will not be granted if it is determined that, due to extended absence, an apprentice will be unable to keep up with course work or will cause an undue disruption to other learners. If you expect to experience or have experienced an extended absence due to exceptional circumstances, meet with your instructor and or Academic Chair to determine the best course of action.

DETERMINING SUCCESS IN CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION

To complete a period of classroom instruction in an apprenticeship program, an apprentice must receive from a post-secondary institution:

- a cumulative weighted average mark of 65% or higher in the theory component for that period of classroom instruction,
- a cumulative weighted average mark of 65% or higher in each practical component for that period of classroom instruction, and
- a mark of 50% or higher on every section of the theory and practical components for that period of classroom instruction.



SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

The cumulative weighted average is calculated by applying the weighting identified in the [curriculum guide](#) to the apprentice's mark for each section of the course and adding the results together.

Not meeting the requirements of classroom instruction will prevent the apprentice's ability to progress to the next period of apprenticeship and you will not be eligible to write the provincial or interprovincial exam.



CURRICULUM GUIDE



REVIEW

Training providers are responsible for all marks reported to the Government of Alberta. The Executive Director will not adjust marks if the apprentice has not received the minimum pass mark during classroom instruction.

The above applies only to classroom instruction and does not apply to provincial or interprovincial exams, which have a pass mark of 70%.

PROVINCIAL AND INTERPROVINCIAL EXAM RULES

It is important to understand both the provincial and interprovincial exams are administered and governed by Apprenticeship and Industry Training and are thus privy to the policies and procedures as determined by AIT. The pass mark for these exams is 70%, which includes theory and practical exams in specific trades. Conditional passes are no longer granted. i.e. 69.5% is a fail. Students must achieve 70% or greater on the provincial exam

What to bring

- A physical ID either government issued photo ID or photo ID provided by the educational institute (i.e. Student ID card).
- Standard HB pencil and eraser
- Water bottle (in a closable, clear container)

What not to bring

- ANY electronic device, such as smart phones, laptops, tablets, or anything with a computer chip
- Mechanical pencil and/or pen
- Textbooks, notebooks, or any other written material
- Backpacks, purses, bags, etc.
- Jackets, hoodies, coats, etc.
- Motorcycle helmets, skateboards, bike helmets, etc.
- Your own calculator

Breach of these rules, and any other rules (written or implied), will be treated as cheating. See AIT policy on cheating on exams for more information. Specific details on exam rules and policies can be found on tradesecrets.alberta.ca

An apprentice who completes one period of classroom instruction may wish to immediately enter the next period without an on-the-job training component between the two. For further information, you must speak to the Office of the Registrar.
