

I am struck by two milestones we will observe this year of 2022, neither of which would seem to have much to do with each other.

The first and more trivial is the 25th anniversary of the blockbuster film Titanic. I realize that it came out before a large portion of our SAIT students were even born- but I remember the release of the film well! And in the midst of the utter chaos which has enveloped our lives for the past two years- and counting- it is not surprising, at times, to feel like we're clinging to life on a sinking ship.
