Position Title: eGaming League Student Leader

Department: Student Engagement, Learner and Academic Services

Term: Fall 2021 – Winter 2022

Number of Positions: 3

Hours: 3-5 per week dependent on student schedules

Length of Position: August 2021 – April 2022 (with potential for extension)

This is a competitive, volunteer student leadership opportunity open to current SAIT students. Competition for leadership positions will remain open until suitable candidates are found.

Position Description

SAIT Student Engagement works to support the success of students by delivering inclusive programming and strengthening community. We do this in cooperation with all SAIT departments and schools. The Student Engagement Office is looking for dynamic and dedicated students to assist with the development, delivery and promotion of the SAIT eGaming League and its associated activities.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Assist with development and delivery of SAIT eGaming League activities and events. This includes weekly game nights, tournaments, etc.
- Actively promote the eGaming League and events to the SAIT community on various social media platforms as requested (i.e. Discord, Facebook, etc).
- Oversee the SAIT eGaming Discord to ensure that effective and continuous engagement and connection with SAIT gamers is maintained.
- Support the recruitment of players from the SAIT community and field inquiries.
- Assist with the planning, development and delivery of SAIT-wide tournaments.
- Facilitate SAIT gamer introductions and help build a SAIT community of gamers online.
- Provide tips, tricks, and links to supports for students who are new to gaming.
- Play and engage with players and teams in a variety of games including but not limited to:
 - League of Legends
 - Rocket League
 - Valorant
 - Chess
- Attend student leadership training and other relevant professional development and training sessions that will be offered throughout each semester.
- Engage in other duties as opportunities allow.

- Develop leadership skills, intercultural competency, and communication, event planning and organizational skills while working on a diverse team. Gain experience through training and professional development opportunities throughout the year.
- Develop your Co-curricular Record. Student Engagement Leaders may document their hours and experiences on an official SAIT Co-curricular Record for future employment.

Commitment

Successful applicants are expected to fulfill 50 hours (3-5 per week) of SAIT LEADS leadership involvement including training and professional development workshops per semester. Shift schedules will be determined at the beginning of each semester.

Qualifications

The Student Engagement office is a dynamic group of people, with a variety of skills, abilities, views and beliefs. We are seeking student leaders to foster and support an environment of connecting, learning, practicing and serving. The ideal candidate for an eGaming Student Leader:

- Has completed at least one semester as a SAIT student and has good familiarity with the SAIT community (services, policies, etc.).
- Has skill in a variety of games and experience coordinating and participating in eGaming tournaments.
- Is an enthusiastic team player with a positive attitude.
- Is globally-minded with a passion for inclusion and helping others. Must be open and sensitive to all individuals regardless of race, color, religion, gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, national origin, educational background, ability or age.
- Is able to work well independently and with a team.
- Is a self-starter, reliable and can complete detailed projects from start to finish.
- Strong interpersonal skills and the ability to easily engage and build rapport with peers and various stakeholders.
- Must have the ability to work during the day, in between and before and after classes; occasionally on weekends.
- Must have the ability to work during exam-dense periods.
